Culture Fest Culture Feast



In 2018 we celebrated Canadian Multiculturalism Day with Culture Fest / Culture Feast, a youth planned and led event. Youth selected six cultures to celebrate based on their personal experiences - Mexican, Indigenous Peoples, Indian, Chinese, Turkish, and Syrian Culture.

Highlights included handmade flags representing each culture, youth trying new foods for the very first time, and bhangra dancing. Culture Fest / Culture Feast was a huge success from an event standpoint, but even more successful when we look at the months of planning and discussion about acceptance, belonging and celebrating diversity.

Every day at our Youth Centres, as part of our Eat Right, Future Bright program, our staff and volunteers actively engaged youth in preparing healthy snacks for their peers. We also continued to host two dinner nights every month. To extend the reach of this program into the community, we started the 'Chef of the Month' initiative, with one youth from each Centre given a full 'chef's home cooking kit' to recreate that month's meal at home with their families.
